


Club Overall





CAP PATROL

Cap Patrol is a system that monitors player's handicaps and scores to present the Handicap Committee data needed to make an adjustment to a player's GHIN index. The system uses an algorithm that takes consideration factors including:

- A players' potential or ability in recent play and tournament rounds
- Variance in home vs. away performance
- Disparity in casual vs. competitive scores reported
- Placement in club sponsored tournaments/events



Members that are recommended for an adjustment by Cap Patrol will be reviewed by the handicap committee prior to each event. Any member that is up for an adjustment will be notified via email prior to the event.

Members can download the Cap Patrol app by searching "Cap Patrol" in the App store on your device. You will need your GHIN number and email address to log in. The features of the app include:

- An easier way to keep track of your current play and how you have played in the past.
- Built in games for you and fellow members. See how others have been playing recently and set up the most competitive teams, odds and more. Use the "who's hot" feature to see who has been playing the best
- Track and compare your play at home, away, in tournaments and more

COMPLIANCE INSPECTIONS 2025 & RECOMMENDED AREAS OF FOCUS FOR ALL MFMBFRS

As your Community Liaison, the Compliance team would like to remind all members of the importance of maintaining their property in accordance with community guidelines. Our goal is to ensure the safety, cleanliness, and visual harmony of the neighborhood. To avoid receiving compliance notice, we encourage everyone to stay proactive with property upkeep.

Top Items We Look for During Compliance Drives:

- **1. Overgrown vegetation** Grass, weeds, and brush that are not regularly maintained.
- 2. Dead plant material Including dead trees, shrubs, or fallen branches.
- 3. Improper storage Items such as tools, equipment, building materials, or furniture stored outside and visible from the street.
- 4. Unapproved structures dog runs, fences, or other additions that have not gone through proper architectural approval.
- 5. Visible clutter Excessive personal items left in yards, on porches, or around the home.
- 6. Driveway and pathway conditions Cracked, broken, or poorly maintained surfaces can result in notices.
- 7. **Debris accumulation** Piles of yard waste, construction debris, or other materials.
- 8. Unauthorized vehicles no yard parking, inoperable vehicles or covered vehicles, trailers parked in driveways or on street.

How to Avoid a Violation:

- Walk your property regularly and look at it from the street view, and golf course view, what do others see?
- Schedule routine maintenance for vegetation and landscaping.
- Submit any improvement plans to the DRC before making changes.
- Keep outdoor areas tidy, especially after storms or projects.
- If unsure whether something is compliant, reach out to the Community Liaison—I'm here to help!

Regular inspections will take place weekly. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our community beautiful and well-maintained.

Plan submittals are required to have a digital copy (PDF). Digital copies can be sent to **designreview@fhgc.com**

SMALL PROJECTS

Smaller projects such as landscaping, re-paints, dog runs, minor additions and other minor changes can be reviewed weekly by the DRC, typically on Tuesdays.

Please note it is important members follow the steps of the Design Review Process, including submission of required applications as found on our member website. This is a proven and streamlined process provided the owner performs per the Development Standards for any exterior alterations to the owner's property including projects such as:

- 1. Roof Replacements
- 2. Exterior Painting
- 3. Deck Projects
- 4. Dog Runs
- 5. Landscaping
- 6. Driveways

H-2B VISA PROGRAM

WHAT IS IT AND HOW DOES IT ENHANCE OUR COMMUNITY?

Every summer morning at precisely 5:45 a.m., a white shuttle van winds its way through Forest Highlands on its way to the Meadow and Canyon clubhouses. The shuttles continue throughout each day on the half-hour.

The passengers Inside the vehicle are young men and women from across the globe. They represent our community's seasonal employees who participate in the H-2B Visa program.



WHAT IS THE VISA PROGRAM AND WHAT ARE THE ORIGINS OF THE OPERATION?


According to the U.S. Department of Labor, the definition of H-2B Visa:

A nonimmigrant program that permits employers to temporarily hire nonimmigrants to perform nonagricultural labor or services in the United States.



THE EARLY YEARS

The H-2B Visa program was introduced to Forest Highlands in 2018 by Bill Griffon, our former General Manager. He was assisted by Robin Ayers, the previous Human Resources Director, who oversaw the program, made travel arrangements, secured lodging and helped with their assimilation.





The summer hires all lived in the same apartment in downtown Flagstaff and a plan was implemented to run to and from Forest Highlands throughout the day.

The number of H-2B staffers grew to a high-water mark in 2023, shared Martin. There were 115 employees that served in various departments two seasons ago. The number dropped in 2024, when 87 positions were filled.

THE CULINARY EXPERIENCE

In 2025, a large percentage of the H-2B's will once again play an important role in the Food and Beverage department.

Mark Thomas, CCM, Director of Food & Beverage, provides an update on the upcoming season. "We will have a total of 50 Visa employees, 20 in the Front of the House and 30 in the Back of the House.

"This is a very popular program within the club industry as a resource for seasonal help. This leads to challenges for those participating in H-2B. Arrival dates, government approval and policy updates change annually. It requires patience and vigilance for all involved." Thomas explained. "Our Human Resources department does an incredible job managing these challenges and helping each department overcome these obstacles every year."

Thomas describes other advantages to the membership.

"The biggest benefit is the culinary team. To have trained culinary professionals arrive and be ready to work the next day is a tremendous benefit. Experienced seasonal culinary staff are just not available in Flagstaff or Arizona. Forest Highlands would have a totally different culinary experience without the trained professionals in our Back of the House kitchen operations.

"The Front of the House service staff has other benefits," continued Thomas. "The servers are also trained hospitality professionals who do not require the same level of training as local staff. They are also invaluable late in the season when local staff return to school or leave for other jobs."

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
In total, the Visa employees contribute in many ways. Among other departments that utilize the H-2B's are the golf staff, course maintenance, housekeeping, and racquet sports.

As to the overall contribution, Thomas provides perspective with feedback received over the years:

"The other benefit I hear from members is how much they enjoy learning about other cultures and the Visa staff's countries of origin."

FUN FACTS ABOUT YOUR UTILITY DEPARTMENT

- 8 ADEQ certified employees, including Brianne Eekhoff.
- 10 deep water wells, ranging from 1,200 to 1,600 feet deep, producing between 55 to 310 gallons per minute. Together, we can produce up to 1.5 million gallons per day!
- The drinking water distribution system consists of over **20 miles of underground piping.**
- Last year, 18 million gallons of effluent were treated at the wastewater treatment plant.
- We have a **20 million gallon** storage capacity for course irrigation.

COMMON AREA MAINTENANCE

Our Common Area Maintenance team plays a vital role in keeping the facilities clean, well-maintained, and running smoothly. From replacing building siding to handling custodial duties across the facilities, sweeping streets, ensuring ice machines along the golf course are in working order, setting up tents for holiday festivities, and more, this dedicated team goes above and beyond.

CURRENT BIG PROJECTS

- Road Maintenance: The team has crack-sealed the roads, repainted all road lines, speed bumps, and parking lot lines, and added a few speed limit signs.
- Road Study: Western
 Technologies is conducting
 a study to assess the current
 condition of our roads.
- Patio Furniture Prep: The patio furniture for the clubhouses, tennis facility, Stonehouse, and pickleball courts has been sanded, refinished, and is being prepped for the upcoming season.
- Walking Path Resurfacing: The
 walking path from the northern
 intersection of Bessie Kidd Best
 to between Hole 5 and Hole
 6 on the Meadow course is
 being resurfaced. The process
 includes spreading 3 inches of
 AB aggregate, adding water,
 compacting it with a roller, and
 treating it with soil conditioner
 to ensure durability.

While the entire team plays a role in keeping our water and wastewater systems running smoothly, I'm the one you'll hear when you call the Utility Office.

A key part of my job is handling monthly utility billing, but I also do a lot more. I answer questions from members regarding their utility bills, work with Waste Management to ensure timely trash collection and dumpster services, and assist members with building plans for home additions or renovations—there's a good chance we have those plans on file! Additionally, I work closely with contractors and members on new home builds to ensure they're all set up with water service.

There's so much more I do, but I truly enjoy every aspect of my role here at Forest Highlands.



FOREST HIGHLANDS RESIDENTIAL TRASH, RECYCLING, PINE NEEDLE BAG, AND DUMPSTER SERVICE INFORMATION

Dear Forest Highlands Residents,

As we approach the peak of the season, we want to ensure all members are fully informed about the trash, recycling, pine needle, and dumpster services available at Forest Highlands. Please review the updated information below to ensure smooth operations and proper service.



TRASH & RECYCLING SERVICES

Waste Management Provider:

• **Contact Information:** For any questions, concerns, or requests related to trash and recycling, please reach out to the Forest Highlands Utilities Office at (928) 525-5244.



- Toter Details:
 - Trash Toter: Bright green
 - Recycling Toter: Bright green with a blue lid
 - **Old Provider Norton Environmental**: Some members may still have Norton toters. If damaged or taken, these will be replaced with Waste Management toters.

Service Fees:

- **Trash Service:** \$13.25 per month
- **Recycling Service:** \$9.00 per month (optional; must opt-in by contacting the Utilities Office)

Toter Requirements:

- Mandatory Trash Toter: Every household must have a trash toter.
- Damaged or Missing Toters: Contact the Utilities
 Office for replacements or assistance with damaged or missing toters.

Additional Toters:

- Each household is provided with one trash toter and one recycling toter (if opted in).
- Additional toters are available through the Utilities
 Office at \$8.00 per month per toter. These toters will
 be billed directly by Waste Management, separate
 from your Forest Highlands utility bill.

Toter Placement Tips:

- Ensure Proper Placement: Place your toters at the edge of the road by 6:00 AM on the day of service, but no earlier than 24 hours before the scheduled pickup.
- Clear of Obstructions: Make sure your toters are free of any obstacles, such as vehicles, mailboxes, or landscaping.
- **Spacing:** If you have multiple toters, ensure they are spaced at least 4 feet apart for efficient collection.
- Overfilled Toters: Do not overfill your toters. Lids that won't close will result in your toter not being emptied. Overfilled cans can attract animals and lead to scattered trash.

PICKUP SCHEDULES & GUIDELINES

Trash & Recycling Pickup:

- Trash Pickup: Every Monday
- Recycling Pickup: Every other Monday (dates are posted on utility bills or available by calling the Utilities Office).

Missed Pickups:

 If your toters are missed, please notify the Utilities Office. A recovery pickup will be arranged for the following day (Tuesday). If your toter is a Norton brand, Waste Management will replace it with their own toter.

PINE NEEDLE BAG PICKUP

Pine Needle Bag Service:

- January July: The cost of pine needle bag pickup is covered by the Forest Highlands Association as part of fire prevention efforts.
- August December: A fee of \$4.50 per bag will be charged for pickup, which will be billed by Utilities on behalf of Waste Management.

Pickup Schedule:

- Every Tuesday during the season; during the winter months (December through April), it will be the first Tuesday of each month.
- How to Prepare: Pine needle bags should be stacked adjacent to the road near the lot address marker before Tuesday morning for pickup.





COMMUNITY DUMPSTERS & BULK GARBAGE DUMPSTERS

Recycling Dumpsters:

Locations:

- Behind the Fire Department (emptied every Monday and Thursday during the season, and every Thursday during the winter).
- In front of the Public Works Yard Gate (available when the Fire Department recycling dumpster is full).

Accepted Materials:

- Newspapers, office paper, cardboard, clean plastic, aluminum, tin.
- Not all recycling dumpsters have a glass specific bin, so glass can go in any compartment on the recycling dumpsters.

Bulk Garbage Dumpster:

Locations:

- Located off Paleo Place, in front of the security gate near the Public Works Yard.

Access Hours:

- Monday to Friday: 7 AM - 3 PM

- Saturday: 7 AM - 12 PM

Items Not Allowed: Construction debris and hot ashes.
 Refrigerators, fluorescent light bulbs, wet paint, tires,
 car batteries are also all items that are not allowed.

SPEED LIMITS WITHIN FOREST HIGHLANDS

SPEED LIMIT ON FOREST HIGHLANDS DRIVE IS 25 MPH

As of December 1, 2024, the speed limit on Forest Highlands Drive was reduced from 35 MPH to 25 MPH. This change is part of our ongoing commitment to safety and our goal to foster a secure and comfortable environment for all community members and their guests. Enforcement began on December 1st 2024. Thank you for your attention to this and ensuring the safety of everyone within the community.

SPEED LIMITS

The speed limits on the roads at Forest Highlands are as follows:

- 10 MPH in the Clubhouse parking lots.
- 15 MPH through the Gate House access area, in or around the Mail room, on all roads in the Cottage developments, in all posted "Children Playing" and "Pedestrian" zones.
- 25 MPH on all main roads inside Forest Highlands.
- 25 MPH on Forest Highlands Drive between the Gate House & Mailroom.

FIREWISE INSPECTIONS 2025 & SUGGESTED ITEMS FOR ALL MEMBERS TO FOCUS ON

In 2025 the entire community is strongly encouraged to participate in maintaining defensible spaces for their lots and bring them into compliance with Firewise standards.

The results of proactively complying to Firewise standards this season will further mitigate fire risk for the entire community and is suggested due to the dry winter conditions our region suffered this winter. Lots outside of zone 5 will not receive a pass of fail rating however if you have completed the Firewise Safety Check from and wish to have a Firewise certified officer inspect your lot please contact Security to schedule an appoint to have it inspected.

In 2025, the assigned Firewise zone for Forest Highlands is Zone 5 (comprising lots: 701-872). Firewise Safety Checks for these lots will be conducted in early June. To help those in Zone 5, as well as all residents of Forest Highlands, please click the link to find the "Safety Check" form used by Firewise Officers, by clicking the button below.

SAFETY CHECK

All Forest Highlands residents are encouraged to make/keep their lot(s) safe. **Below are a few suggestions in maintaining a Firewise Defensible Space on your lot(s):**

- · Remove dead fuels from your property
- Remove dead standing trees and logs from the ground less than 16" in diameter
- · Remove dead shrubby materials
- Cut down dried grasses and flowers
- Remove needles, leaves, and branches from the ground, leaving an organic covering of approximately 2"
- Clear needles and leaves from roofs and gutters
- Store firewood at least 30' (if possible; minimum of 10') up-hill from your home

DWELLINGLIVE "RESIDENT/GUEST" ONLINE PROGRAM – REVIEW & LIST CLEAN UP



Thank you to the many members that have worked with Security on a community Guest/Visitor list cleanup project in the past. It is believed at a minimum an annual maintenance/review of guest lists creates reliable lists and minimizes unauthorized community entry. Security has begun a review of guest lists and in April if your list is found to be extensive, a copy of your list will be emailed with suggestions on how to reduce the list and manage going forward.

A few quick tips when using your dwellingLIVE account:

- 1. Consider using the "PERMANENT" guest option for only family members and a few regular contractors such as a cleaning company and a handyman; and
- 2. Contact Security to establish your own personal dwellingLIVE account so you can maintain your own list. The account can be arranged by emailing security@fhgc.com and asking to set up the account; please provide your member number when requesting the account.

SOLD A VEHICLE OR CHANGED A WINDSHIELD?

Please help the Security Department update your electronic dwellingLIVE resident/guest profile. A few reasons records are inaccurate:

- A new vehicle is purchased and someone moves a transponder from the sold vehicle to the purchased vehicle. It is important to update Security with the vehicle(s) change
- Windshield replacement. It is important to let Security know the transponder was not taken off the replaced windshield because the transponder remains active and could be used for unauthorized access into Forest Highlands
- Acquiring a vehicle and placing a new transponder on the vehicle; normally this means a vehicle has been sold. It is important to update Security so the sold vehicle can be removed from your personal dwellingLIVE profile. This type of action prevents unauthorized access to Forest Highlands





BIKING SAFETY RULES

6.13 Biking

When riding a standard bicycle, battery-powered bicycle, scooter, battery-powered scooter, electric bicycle, e-bike, or any similar battery powered two-wheeled vehicle that does not have a combustion engine that burns fuel, within Forest Highlands, riders must stay on the right hand side of the road, traveling with traffic and adhere to all traffic signs. Biking is allowed on the cart paths before and after golfing hours, (generally before 7:00 am and after 7:00 pm). The following tips are recommended for your safety [mandatory for all riders up to and including 14 years of age]:

- 1. Wear an approved helmet
- 2. Be visible, wear bright clothes
- 3. Use lights at night
- 4. Stay in a single file formation
- 5. Accompany children on bikes
