


Annual Report 2023-24 Fiscal Year

Flagstaff Housing Facts

As of January 2025, the **median sale price** for homes in Flagstaff was approximately **\$738,668** – **76% higher** than the national average.



To **afford a median-priced home** in Flagstaff households need to have an **annual Income over \$180,000**, nearly **3X the City's median** household income of \$65,000




